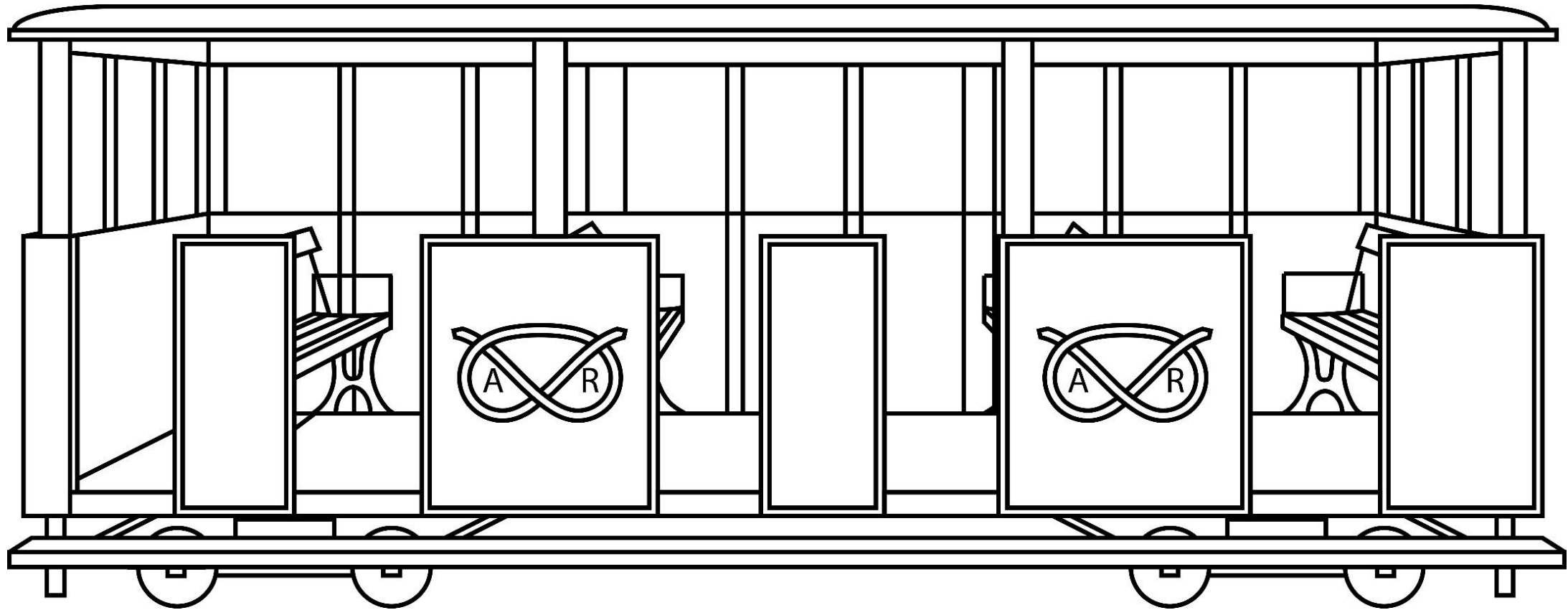

Amerton Railway



At Amerton we have three carriages built by EE Baguley Ltd in Burton-on-Trent. Originally delivered to Wilsons Pleasure Railway, Allhallows-on-Sea in Kent in 1939 along with diesel Engine 'Dreadnought'. After the war they went to Walton-on-the-Naze pier in Essex till 1978, when the pier was damaged in a storm. After this they were sold to the Camelot theme park in Lancashire. In 1987 they moved again to Hewitts Farm in Orpington. Finally, in September 1991 all three coaches moved to Amerton. 2 of these carriages are used on pretty much all our running days. The third did see service for a short while by Santa as his grotto, but has since been re-built into a balcony coach which you will see at the railway soon!
